Course Objectives:

This Unit is designed:

- To describe the procedures followed in controlling and supervising the delivery and collection of outbound and inbound containers by road, rail and inland waterway transport.
- To outline the procedures for handing over supervisory responsibilities at the end of a shift.
- To review the general responsibilities of the supervisor in receipt/delivery operations.
- To improve the quality of supervision of the receipt/delivery operation and to provide the knowledge and skills for a critical review of current supervisory procedures and mechanisms.
