- Research papers that are published in symposiums or workshops are evaluated according to the committee's opinion.
- The candidate must provide a statement that proves his/her attendance in a conference and that a presentation of the research paper is presented by him/her or by a co-researcher.
- The poster is not evaluated as a scientific production.
